It is within this dynamic that the "Incredible Entrepreneur" program, led by SMAV Lot in the Lot Valley region, has been launched. This initiative aims to facilitate connections between business sellers and buyers through an original and intensive process, enabling business takeover projects to be finalized in just 36 hours.

Beyond the transfer of businesses, this operation helps to highlight our local traders, artisans and know-how, while strengthening the attractiveness of our territory to new project promoters.

The BHAP Community of Municipalities, responsible for the economic development agency is an essential partner in this initiative. It supports the implementation of the program and serves as a key point of contact for project leaders as well as entrepreneurs wishing to sell their businesses.

So, whether you are a shopkeeper, a business owner, or a company director considering a transfer of ownership, or a project leader looking for an opportunity, you can now contact the Monflanquin town hall or the Communauté de communes (local council) to find out more and register for this program. Registration is free and open to all.

By relying on initiatives like this one, Monflanquin reaffirms its commitment: to support its economic actors, to enhance its local heritage and to promote its territory.

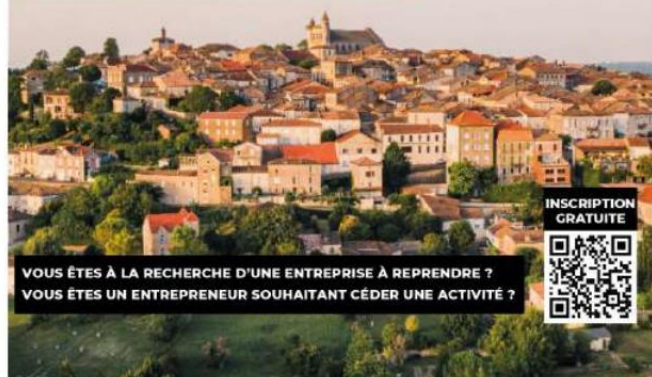

# ARRIVAL OF YOUNG FIREFIGHTERS

For your information, here is a brief summary of the year 2025 for the Monflanquin fire station:

The center carried out 440 interventions, 54 more than in 2024. This is the third time in ten years that the threshold of 400 outings has been exceeded.

The team consists of 28 volunteer firefighters, men and women combined, including a nurse and a doctor.

Thank you all for your vigilance in preserving the serenity of our village.



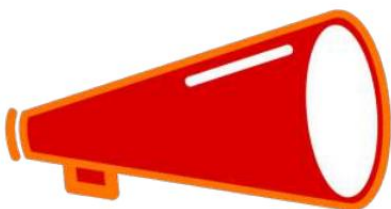
As part of the update of the municipal register of vulnerable persons:

# POOL MUNICIPAL

After some initial work to get everything up and running, the municipal swimming pool  
The pool will open on Saturday, June 27th and Sunday afternoon, June 28th. During the season, the pool will be supervised by three people: two certified lifeguards (BEESAN) who will provide swimming lessons, and one certified lifeguard (BNSSA). Two of them will be housed by the municipality in renovated facilities near the lake. We have an agreement with ProSport, which is providing us with professionals for this season.

Furthermore, in the coming years, the municipality would like to make the swimming pool available from June for our young schoolchildren and college students.

## SCHOOL ELEMENTARY

Elementary school: job cut.

Upon taking office, the Mayor was informed of a planned elimination of a teaching position at the elementary school for the 2026 school year. Elected officials, parent representatives, and parents mobilized quickly, holding a demonstration in front of the elementary school, which was covered by the press. However, on April 20th, we received confirmation of the position's elimination from the regional education inspector. As a reminder, there are currently 91 students enrolled; this number is projected to reach 87 in September 2026, subject to new enrollments. The municipal team extends its full support to the teachers and parents.

# 4 CANTONS BHAP

An exceptional 2026 season for all sections.

In Monflanquin, the 4 Cantons BHAP represent much more than a rugby club. A true player in local life, the club brings renown to our region not only through its sporting achievements, but also through the human values and social connection it fosters on a daily basis.

With 415 members, 14 teams, 22 coaches, 29 educators and more than 130 volunteers, the 4 Cantons BHAP confirm their aeronautics and their solid territorial roots.

#### AT THE PBVF TOURNAMENT

Beyond their sporting achievements on the field, this trip was a fantastic human experience, marked by camaraderie, fair play, and wonderful encounters with the other delegations. ### PBVF TRAIL OF LOT-ET-GARONNE

On the weekend of May 16th and 17th, 2026, Monflanquin had the pleasure of hosting the start of the first stage of the "Trail of the Most Beautiful Villages of France in the Lot-et-Garonne" (department 47). For two days, runners traversed several towns and villages in the region along a route that blended heritage, landscapes, and a friendly atmosphere. The inaugural stage, linking Monflanquin to Villeréal, set the tone for a festive and unifying event, punctuated by entertainment in the Place des Arcades and the presence of numerous residents, volunteers, and visitors who came to cheer on the participants.

Beyond the sporting performance, this event illustrated the quality of the partnership around the association "Le Trail des Plus Beaux Villages de France" and the municipalities involved in this project: Monflanquin, Penne-d'Agenais, Pujols, Tournon-d'Agenais, Villeréal, but also Dausse, a municipality crossed by the circuit.
